

Family Art Gallery

Let's create an art gallery at home!

Galleries are places that display all types of art that you can sometimes buy! If you owned a gallery, what kind of art would you display? Would you sell it to other people? Whom would you invite to your gallery? What would they want to know about the artwork?

Materials

4–5 objects from around your house 4–5 small pieces of paper (one for each object) Pencil or pen



Select 4–5 objects from around your house to display as art in your gallery. Consider using photos, toys, or things you have made. Ask for permission if the objects belong to someone else.



Arrange the artworks in the order you would want your gallery visitors to see them.



Place a piece of paper by each work. These will be your gallery labels.



On each piece of paper, write the the name of the artist or maker (or "Artist unknown"), the title of the artwork, and what it is made of. Add the price you would charge for the artwork, or the phrase "Not for sale."
