

Storytelling Drawing

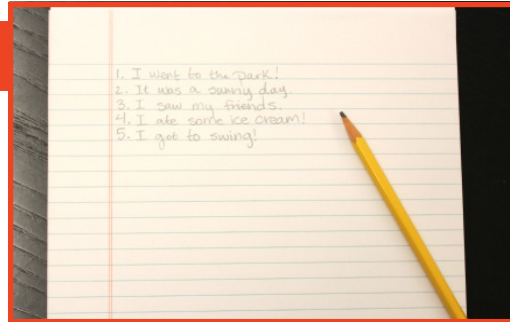
Let's tell a story through a drawing!

Materials

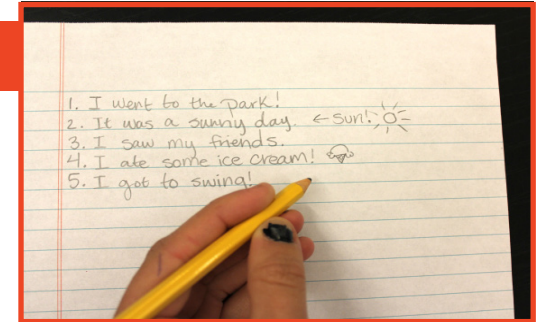
- 1 sheet of notebook paper
